## Planting for Hospice Oct. 11, 2008

Lisa Miller requested miniature daffodils for the front rock garden area. The following short varieties were selected.

# **Narcissus Baby Moon**

A free-flowering, pale canary-yellow miniature, Baby Moon is great for rock gardens! One of the very latest narcissus to flower. Bulb size: 10 cm/up. May. 7". HZ: 5-9.

## **Narcissus Jetfire**

An early-blooming naturalizer, this celebrated American hybrid has a vivid yellow, reflexed perianth and a strong orange trumpet. Bulb size: 14/16 cm. April. 8" to 10". HZ: 3-8.

# Narcissus jonquilla simplex

Circa 1750, this late-flowering, fragrant species has numerous, golden-yellow flowers per stem with reed-like foilage. Bulb size: 6 cm/up. Late April. 10" to 12". HZ: 5-9.

### **Narcissus Little Gem**

Circa 1938, this early-flowering jewel is clear yellow with a deep yellow, flared trumpet. Bulb size: 10/12 cm. April. 5" to 6". HZ: 4-8

#### **Narcissus Small Talk**

A charming Grant Mitsch variety, this golden-yellow miniature looks like a little starburst in the garden. Bulb size: 8/10 cm. April. 5î to 6î. HZ: 4-8.

#### **Narcissus Sundisc**

Its bright buttercup-yellow petals so overlap one another around its slightly darker, disk-shaped cup, that they really do appear as little 2î disks of bright garden spotlights. It has narrow foliage and a sweet fragrance. Late flowering. Bulb size: 10/12 cm. May.
